Innovative Leitmotifs In Indian English Fiction

Abstract:

The later part of 20th century and the beginning of the 21st century has shown to the world that English literature is no longer the sole domain of the Imperial England. The English people have themselves sown the seeds of the unexpected developments and the unprecedented growth of Indian English Literature today. Indian English fiction has always been progressive and responsive to the contemporary changes of material reality and theoretical perspectives since it was born as Indo-Anglian Literature.
